


MISSION #1

Notice a problem and
stop to solve it.

Word detectives are always on the lookout.

Word Detectives make sure to look across
the WHOLE word from start to end.

Word detectives use everything they know
to solve problems.

Do a s-l-o-w

MISSION #4: Slow Check
When word detectives think they know
what a word might say, they do a s-l-o-w
check to be sure. They say the word slowly
as they slide their finger under the word.
They check that all the parts look right.

Opinion Writing

Opinion- state your opinion clearly!

Reason- give some reasons or information to support your opinion.

Examples- give details to support your opinion.

Opinion- Restate your opinion with feeling!

An opinion is a belief, way or judgment of thinking about something.

Sentence Starters:

In my opinion... I think...

I prefer... I feel...

EXAMPLE: Reese's are the best in my opinion.

R1- They taste sweet.

R2- They come in different sizes.

R3- I love the taste of peanut butter.

Closing- I think Reese's are the best because they are tasty and delicious!
